FROM NEW HAVEN AND WEST:

I-95 NORTH TO CONNECTICUT EXIT 65. RIGHT TURN AT EXIT RAMP TO SECOND STOP LIGHT IN CENTER OF TOWN. LEFT ONTO ROUTE 1 NORTH (BOSTON POST ROAD). GO UP ABOUT HALF A MILE. WATER'S EDGE ENTRANCE WILL BE ON YOUR RIGHT.

FROM HARTFORD AND NORTH:

I-91 SOUTH OR I-84 WEST TO HARTFORD. FROM HARTFORD, TAKE I-91 SOUTH TO ROUTE 9. THEN ROUTE 9 SOUTH TO EXIT 3. GO THROUGH STOP SIGN TO SECOND STOP SIGN. TURN RIGHT ONTO ROUTE 153 SOUTH AND FOLLOW TO THE END OF ROUTE UNTIL INTERSECTION WITH ROUTE 1 IN WESTBROOK. AT LIGHT, TURN LEFT ONTO ROUTE 1 NORTH (BOSTON POST ROAD). GO UP ABOUT HALF A MILE. WATER'S EDGE ENTRANCE WILL BE ON YOUR RIGHT.

- Identify and describe sexual assault demographics and typical injury patterns seen in sexual assault.
- List components of the typical rape exam kit and identify tools that might aid in evidence Collection.
- Describe acceptable methods of obtaining evidence during a sexual assault exam.
- Discuss the role of the sexual assault nurse exam, including where this resource is available.
- List various treatment regimens for post-exposure prophylaxis after a sexual assault.
- Discuss the care, management and Treatment Priorities of the poisoned patient.
- Overview of the toxidromes and their presentation.
- Discuss specific antidotes and their current clinic use.
- Present specific clinical scenarios and construct a multi-disciplinary approaches to patient care which begins in the Emergency Department.
- Describe clinical scenarios in which ultrasound is utilized as a tool for rapid diagnosis and management.
- Identify and show specific examples of key anatomic landmarks of emergency department ultrasound including examples of the cardiac exam, pelvic exam, FAST exam and gyn exam.
- Show novel uses of ultrasound including ocular and thoracic exams.
- Demonstrate visual examples of pathology which can should and can be recognized by the emergency physician.
- Define palliative care and describe its basic principles and how it can be applied in the emergency department.
- Describe the physical, psychological, social and spiritual issues of dying patients and their families.
- Demonstrate knowledge of the pharmacology of drugs used in pain and symptom management.
- Identify how the ED can assist in providing supportive counseling and connection to community resources for those coping with loss.
- Describe an approach to managing the particular ethical issues at the end of life including withdrawing or withholding therapy, advance directives, euthanasia and assisted suicide.
